More than 300 ethnic groups, 250 native languages






### Statistics of Students in Primary Schools


### Statistics of Students in Secondary Schools


### Statistics of Primary and Secondary School Teachers


## Faculty Members in Science






Presidents of Republic of Indonesia

#### Indonesian Minister in 2016-now








### **Result of the last 2 Elections**
