The programme

Dutch Minister Van Engelshoven (Education, Culture and Science) opens the programme, on the theme "Driving academic innovation through diversity and inclusion: Towards a more diverse and inclusive scientific environment to enhance equity and excellence."

Keynote speaker is Belle Derks, professor in social and organizational psychology at the University of Utrecht. Belle Derks is expert on social and gender (in)equality.

There are (interactive) plenary and parallel sessions, as well as compact poster presentations. Topics include national frameworks, fostering diversity in open science and AI, and on a team-driven, innovative academic culture where everyone feels included.

Background

The two-day Gender Summit is organised on various continents each year. This 17th edition is the first Summit in the Netherlands. Aim of the Gender Summit is to make gender equality in research and innovation the norm and to embed gender as a primary dimension of quality. The outcome results in recommendations for the European Commission and Parliament. Minister Van Engelshoven (Science) will use the outcome of the Gender Summit for a diversity action plan that will be published in 2020.
